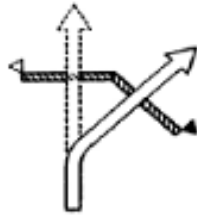
1. Which of these is not a responsibility of a jump judge:

5. Under what circumstances can you stop a horse on the course?



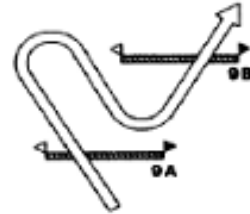
