2010 Equine Practice Inter School Equestrian Competition Regulations

- The competitions will be scheduled to run between 8:30 am and 4 p.m. in accordance with a regular school day.
- The cost will be \$40 per horse per day regardless of events entered.
- Competitions shall be conducted under P.C.A.V. rules except as specified in this document.
- Points from 10 to 5 and ribbons will be awarded to individual competitors who place in the top six in each phase. A saddle blanket will be awarded to the student with the top score on the day. The total points awarded will be reduced for classes with low entries.
 - If 7 or more contestants in a class then all 6 places are awarded with points 10 - 5.
 - For 6 contestants: 6 place ribbons Points to 5 of: 10, 8, 7, 6, 5
 - For 5 contestants: 5 place ribbons Points to 4 of: 10, 8, 6, 5
 - For 4 contestants: 4 place ribbons Points to 3 of: 10, 8, 5
 - For 3 contestants: 3 place ribbons Points to 2 of: 10, 7
 - For 2 contestants: 2 place ribbons Points to 2 of: 10, 6
 - For 1 contestant: 1 place ribbon Points of: 10
- Schools are to organise their contestants into teams of four. Substitutes can be made on the day provided they are made before commencement of the competition. The contestants' scores will be combined to determine the winning team whose school will be awarded the Championship Trophy for the day's competition. P.C.A.V. grades shall be used for dressage and show jumping. If a combination **does not** have a P.C.A.V. grade the following grading shall be used for secondary students in dressage competitions: 12 and under - Grade 4 13 and 14 - Grade 3 15 and over - Grade 2
Primary school students should enter in Grade 5 if they are not pony club graded.
- **Students without P.C.A.V. grading may not compete in jumping events unless they have a signed statement from an NCAS qualified instructor in which they recommend a P.C.A.V. jumping grade.**
- Ages are taken as at day of competition.
- All riders are permitted to ride in long boots or leather gaiters; however, chaps or chappettes are not permitted.
- Riders are encouraged to supply their own back, saddle cloth or bridle numbers however back numbers are supplied.
- A school equestrian coordinator should submit entries and entries will not be accepted from individual students unless the form is signed by a representative of the school acknowledging that they allow the student to attend.
- School coordinators should carry with them parental contact and medical details for each child entered on the day of the competition, in case of emergency. Team coordinators can be either teachers or parents.
- Entries should be returned with a cheque made payable to **Glenbrae Equestrian Club** and a **stamped self addressed envelope** for return of draw.
- **Late entries will not be accepted. Nor will entries not accompanied by the entry fee. If entries are sent by fax or email payment of entry fees may be transferred electronically to Glenbrae Equestrian Club Bendigo Bank BSB 633000 Account Number 127993327.** The enclosed entry form can be used for all competition days throughout 2010. The entry form may be used for both individual and team entries.
- Times for each competition day will be available on the Glenbrae web site, www.glenbrae.net.
- **It is a requirement of our insurers that all riders complete a copy of the attached 'Waiver'. Completed forms must be supplied once each calendar year.**
- **ASA approved helmets (AS / NZS 3838:1998) must be worn when mounted at Glenbrae.**

WAIVER, RIDING AGREEMENT and EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN RIGHTS TO SUE

WARNING: Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the Centre named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are:

- rendered with due care and skill; and
- as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and
- reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the Centre.

Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the Centre is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the Centre under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form

NOTE: The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the Centre's part. "Gross negligence" is defined in the Fair Trading (Recreational Services) Regulations 2004.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

1. Horse riding involves a significant degree of physical exertion and physical risk and is undertaken for the purpose of recreation, enjoyment and leisure.
2. I engage in horse riding entirely at my own risk and accept that horse riding is a dangerous activity with many inherent risks.
3. I accept that I am responsible for my own actions and the actions of those people in my care and control.
4. A reference to 'the Centre' in this contract includes the Glenbrae Equestrian Club, Glenbrae Equestrian Centre, the operating company Jacques R. Pty Ltd and the property owners B. and S. J. Hodgson and C. J. Le Bas de Plumetot, directors, officers, employees, agents, successors and assigns.
5. The services provided by the Centre are 'recreational services' for the purposes of the *Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic)* and *Trade Practices Act 1974 (Cwth)*.
6. The Centre does not make any warranty concerning the nature, habits and disposition of any horse supplied by it.
7. This riding agreement contract is for the calendar year in which it is signed but will apply beyond this time unless revoked.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF RIDING

8. I will waive my rights

I will not bring any claim, demand, action or suit against the Centre in relation to personal injury or death, and also any loss, injury or damage I sustain as a direct or indirect result of horse riding organised by the Centre. This waiver applies irrespective of any liability, fault or negligence of the Centre.

9. I will indemnify the Centre

I will indemnify the Centre against any claim, demand, action or suit brought by third parties (including a child for whom I have responsibility) in relation to any personal injury or death, and also any loss, injury or damage which is a direct or indirect result of horse riding pursuant to this agreement. This indemnity applies irrespective of any liability, fault or negligence of the Centre.

10. I will ride safely

I will only ride the horse in a safe and controlled manner. I will wear an Australian Standard Approved helmet and the correct footwear at all times. I will read and follow all signs on the Centre's property and follow all the Centre's instructions.

11. I will accept and pay for assistance

I consent to being evacuated and to the provision of first aid and medical treatment if I am injured or become ill. I agree to pay for any such evacuation or provision of first aid or medical treatment for myself or my horse. I acknowledge and agree that I will pay any costs or expenses incurred by any person or organisation for or on behalf of my horse or as a result of a quarantine standstill such as in the E1 outbreak in 2007.

12. Health of Horse(s)

I declare that each horse named on the attached entry form will only be transported to the event entered if it
has been in good health and eating normally
has not shown signs of respiratory disease (no nasal discharge, cough or sneeze)
has not had a high temperature (over 39°C) during the three days leading up to the event and had a temperature below 38.5°C immediately prior to departure.

I give my authorisation for the designated Event Horse Health Official to call for veterinary inspection of a horse named on this entry form and in my care should they be showing signs of a respiratory illness at any time during the course of the event. I agree to pay any veterinary fees incurred as a result of this veterinary examination.

AGREEMENTS: By signing this agreement I understand that I and my dependants waive our rights to sue.
